Arrendevole e clemente fin a scapito della giustizia, le inclinazioni sue mondane dovette reprimere a fronte della riforma morale, e a fatica potè favorire un proprio figliuolo, niente i nipoti; esatto del resto ai doveri di capo dei fedeli, ad elevare alla mitra i migliori, a diffondere l'istruzione. Secondo i decreti tridentini stabilì una Congregazione della visita, che sopravedesse a quella di tutte le diocesi, e mandava visitatori apostolici che si faceano rendere i conti delle chiese, de' luoghi pii, delle fraternite, per quanto eccitassero scontentezze. Prescrisse che ogni cattedrale avesse un teologo (1573). Spendendo quanto Leon X, per riparare ai guasti cagionati da questo fondò e dotò ben ventitrè collegi, tra cui quello di tutte le nazioni, alla apertura del quale si pronunziarono discorsi in venticinque favelle; rifondò il Germanico, palestra di futuri atleti; uno pei Greci, che vi erano allevati al modo e col linguaggio e il rito patrio; uno Ungarico, uno Illirico a Loreto, uno pei Maroniti, uno per gl'Inglesi; rifabbricò il Collegio romano, istituì quello de' Neofiti, poi ne seminò per tutta Germania e Francia, e fin tre nel Giappone. Spese due milioni di scudi in fare studiare giovani poveri, e un milione in dotare zitelle.

A suggerimento di lui, il cardinale Ferdinando Medici aprì stamperia di cinquanta lingue orientali, spedì in Etiopia, ad Alessandria, in Antiochia eruditi viaggiatori, massime Giambattista e Girolamo Vecchietti fiorentini, che ne recarono codici. Gregorio teneva una lista di quante persone fossero acconce al vescovado in tutta la cristianità; e così trovavasi informato all'occorrenza. Deputò il vescovo di Como agli Svizzeri per mantenerli in fede, e impedire s'unissero coi Protestanti: e il vescovo di Cremona Bonomo ad emendarvi il clero, nel che trovò grandi contrasti. Giovanni Delfino il 6 e 26 luglio 1572 scriveva al cardinal di Como Tolomeo Gallio, che a Vienna i diecimila italiani erano pervertiti da apostati, venienti dalla Savoja e dal Veneto; ma per ordine dell'imperatore dovettero partire. Il decantato tipografo Frobenio, venuto a Roma, si finse cattolico, tantochè il papa l'accolse con grandi cortesie, ed esortavalo a rimanere; partendo, ebbe raccomandazioni da prelati, e istituì una tipografia cattolica a Friburgo; speculazione, come fu poi lo stampar tante opere in senso contrario a Basilea: dove il papa diede opera non si pubblicasse il Talmud. Gregorio immortalò il suo pontificato colla riforma del calendario. Giulio Cesare l'avea corretto, fissando l'equinozio di primavera ai 25 marzo, e l'anno di trecensessantacinque giorni e sei ore; lo che è 112 423 più del vero: laonde in cenventinove anni l'equinozio si anticipava d'un giorno. La Chiesa dovette prendersene cura, attesochè la pasqua cade nel plenilunio succedente all'equinozio di primavera. Il concilio Niceno del 325 già s'accorgeva che questo anticipavasi al 23 marzo, ma non si seppe indovinarne la ragione. Nel 1257 la precessione era di undici giorni; e fin d'allora si parlò d'una riforma, spesso tentata, non mai riuscita. La famosa Dieta d'Augusta non volle confessare tale anticipazione dell'equinozio, denunziandola per un lacciuolo della politica romana. Come in tutti i Concilj, così nel Tridentino se ne discorse; poi a tal uopo Gregorio XIII convocò a Roma i personaggi meglio versati, e singolarmente il perugino Ignazio Danti domenicano e il gesuita Clavio di Bamberga, ma la formola vera fu rinvenuta da Luigi Lilio medico calabrese, e compita da suo fratello Antonio. Jewish conductor Hermann Levi strove for excellence and recognition as a composer and conductor of classical music in 19th-century Germany. He unerringly devoted himself to the orchestral performance of works by the two major figures of the time: Johannes Brahms and Richard Wagner. In spite of the anti-Semitic atmosphere, Levi saw the conducting of Wagner's works as a major calling: one that pinnacled in the premier performance of Parsifal in Bayreuth. In this biography, newly translated into English by Cynthia Klohr, opera scholar and conductor Fritjof Haas surveys the life and work of this remarkable individual. Born of a long line of rabbis and raised on the ideals of political emancipation of Europe's Jews, Levi sought to break the social constraints and boundaries imposed upon him because of his religious heritage by the power brokers of the classical music scene. Like so many German Jews of his generation, Levi struggled nearly all his life to dissolve the battle between personal lot and social prejudice. Drawing on the wealth of material from the "Leviana" repository in Munich, Germany, Haas artfully weaves together Levi's personal history with his musical milieu to paint a portrait of this ambitious and ambivalent figure in the world of 19th-century German music. This work will be of special interest to musicologists, musicians, opera fans, classical music listeners, and historians and scholars of Judaic studies.

## Renaissance in Italy: pts.1-2: Italian literature; 1881

This Ework on the Renaissance in Italy, of which I now give the last two volumes to the public, was designed and executed on the plan of an essay or analytical inquiry, rather than on that which is appropriate to a continuous history. Each of its four partsNtheEAge of the Despots, theRevival of Learning, the EFine Arts, and Eltalian Literature Nstood in my mind for a section; each chapter for a paragraph; each paragraph for a sentence. At the same time, it was intended to make the first three parts subsidiary and introductory to the fourth, for which accordingly a wider space and a more minute method of treatment were reserved. The first volume was meant to explain the social and political conditions of Italy; the second to relate the exploration of the classical past which those conditions necessitated, and which determined the intellectual activity of the Italians; the third to exhibit the bias of this people toward figurative art, and briefly to touch upon its various manifestations; in order that, finally, a correct point of view might be obtained for judging of their national literature in its strength and limitations. Literature must always prove the surest guide to the investigator of a people's character at some decisive Eepoch. To literature, therefore, I felt that the plan of my book allowed me to devote two volumes. The subject of my inquiry rendered the method I have described, not only natural but necessary. Yet there are special disadvantages, to which progressive history is not liable, in publishing a book of this sort by installments. Readers of the earlier parts cannot form a just conception of the scope and object of the whole. They cannot perceive the relation of its several sections to each other, or give the author credit for his exercise of judgment in the marshaling and development of topics. They criticise each portion independently, and desire a comprehensiveness in parts which would have been injurious to the total scheme. Furthermore, this kind of book sorely needs an Index, and its plan renders a general Index, such as will be found at the end of the last volume, more valuable than one made separately for each part. #### Renaissance in Italy: Italian Literature

As shown by the ever-increasing volume of recordings, editions and performances of the vast repertory of secular cantatas for solo voice produced, primarily in Italy, in the second half of the seventeenth century and the first half of the eighteenth century, this long neglected genre has at last 'come of age'. However, scholarly interest is currently lagging behind musical practice: incredibly, there has been no general study of the Baroque cantata since Eugen Schmitz's handbook of 1914, and although many academic theses have examined microscopically the cantatas of individual composers, there has been little opportunity to view these against the broader canvas of the genre as a whole. The contributors in this volume choose aspects of the cantata relevant to their special interests in order to say new things about the works, whether historical, analytical, bibliographical, discographical or performance-based. The prime focus is on Italian-born composers working between 1650 and 1750 (thus not Handel), but the opportunity is also taken in one chapter (by Graham Sadler) to compare the French cantata tradition with its Italian parent in association with a startling new claim regarding the intended instrumentation. Many key figures are considered, among them Tomaso Albinoni, Giovanni Bononcini, Giovanni Legrenzi, Benedetto Marcello, Alessandro Scarlatti, Alessandro Stradella, Leonardo Vinci and Antonio Vivaldi. The poetic texts of the cantatas, all too often treated as being of little intrinsic interest, are given their due weight. Space is also found for discussions of the history of Baroque solo cantatas on disc and of the realization of the continuo in cantata arias - a topic more complex and contentious than may at first be apparent. The book aims to stimulate interest in, and to win converts to, this genre, which in its day equalled the instrumental sonata in importance, and in which more than a few composers invested a major part of their creativity.

# From Formal Linguistic Theory to the Art of Historical Editions

A haunting and triumphant story of a difficult and keenly felt life, Change Me into Zeus's Daughter is a remarkable literary memoir of resilience, redemption, and growing up in the South. Barbara Robinette Moss was the fourth in a family of eight children raised in the red-clay hills of Alabama. Their wild-eyed, alcoholic father was a charismatic and irrationally proud man who, when sober, captured his children's timid awe, but when (more often) drunk, roused them from bed for severe punishment or bizarre all-night poker games. Their mother was their angel: erudite and stalwart -- her only sin her inability to leave her husband for the sake of the children. Unlike the rest of her family, Barbara bore the scars of this abuse and neglect on the outside as well as the inside. As a result of childhood malnutrition and a complete lack of medical and dental care, the bones in her face grew abnormally ("like a thin pine tree"), and she ended up with what she calls "a twisted, mummy face." Barbara's memoir brings us deep into not only the world of Southern poverty and alcoholic child abuse but also the consciousness of one who is physically frail and awkward, relating how one girl's debilitating sense of her own physical appearance is ultimately saved by her faith in the transformative powers of artistic beauty: painting and writing. From early on and with little encouragement from the world, Barbara embodied the fiery determination to change her fate and achieve a life defined by beauty. At age seven, she announced to the world that she would become an artist -- and so she did. Nightly, she prayed to become attractive, to be changed into "Zeus's daughter," the goddess of beauty, and when her prayers weren't answered, she did it herself, raising the money for years of braces followed by facial surgery. Growing up "so ugly," she felt the family's disgrace all the more acutely, but the result has been a keenly developed appreciation for beauty -- physical and artistic -- the evidence of which can be seen in her writing. Despite the

deprivation, the lingering image from this memoir is not of self-pity but of the incredible bond between these eight siblings: the raucous, childish fun they had together, the making-do, and the total devotion to their desperate mother, who absorbed most of the father's blows for them and who plied them with art and poetry in place of balanced meals. Gracefully and intelligently woven in layers of flashback, the persistent strength of Barbara Moss's memoir is itself a testament to the nearly lifesaving appreciation for literature that was her mother's greatest gift to her children.
