HALO EFFECT Hawthorne or "halo" effect is the tendency of those being observed to change their behavior to meet the expectations of researchers.

INTERACTION The Hawthorne studies paved the way to investigate factors other than formal organizational structure and operations, and established the importance of social structure and worker interaction

LEADERSHIP A major emphasis in the human relations school was the study of organizational leadership, and how leadership affected workers' behavior and the organization's performance. CONFLICT The first and most commonly noted charge is that this theory fails to take into account the potential for conflict between workers and managers.

STRUCTURE Second, the human relations school seemed to discount the effects of formal structure on the members of the organization.
