1945 in Europe and Asia

This is the second in the comprehensive ten-volume Germany and the Second World War. The five volumes so far published in German take the story to the end of 1941, and have achieved international acclaim as a major contribution to historical study. Under the auspices of the Militärgeschichtliches Forschungsamt (Research Institute for Military History), a team of renowned historians has combined a full synthesis of existing material with the latest research to produce what will be the definitive history of the Second World War. This volume surveys the first year of the war deliberately begun by Nazi Germany. The authors examine the train of interconnected political and military events, and set military operations against the background of Hitler's war policy and general aims, both immediate and long term. The authors show that the conflict took a course quite different from that which Hitler had intended, but nevertheless resulted in a series of conquests for the Third Reich.

Germany and the Second World War

Some will be shocked to find out that the United States and Ho Chi Minh, our nemesis for much of the Vietnam War, were once allies. Indeed, during the last year of World War II, American spies in Indochina found themselves working closely with Ho Chi Minh and other anti-colonial factions-compelled by circumstances to fight together against the Japanese. Dixie Bartholomew-Feis reveals how this relationship emerged and operated and how it impacted Vietnam's struggle for independence. The men of General William Donovan's newly-formed Office of Strategic Services closely collaborated with communist groups in both Europe and Asia against the Axis enemies. In Vietnam, this meant that OSS officers worked with Ho Chi Minh and the Viet Minh, whose ultimate aim was to rid the region of all imperialist powers, not just the Japanese. Ho, for his part, did whatever he could to encourage the OSS's negative view of the French, who were desperate to regain their colony. Revealing details not previously known about their covert operations, Bartholomew-Feis chronicles the exploits of these allies as they developed their network of informants, sabotaged the Japanese occupation's infrastructure, conducted guerrilla operations, and searched for downed American fliers and Allied POWs. Although the OSS did not bring Ho Chi Minh to power, Bartholomew-Feis shows that its apparent support for

the Viet Minh played a significant symbolic role in helping them fill the power vacuum left in the wake of Japan's surrender. Her study also hints that, had America continued to champion the anti-colonials and their quest for independence, rather than caving in to the French, we might have been spared our long and very lethal war in Vietnam. Based partly on interviews with surviving OSS agents who served in Vietnam, Bartholomew-Feis's engaging narrative and compelling insights speak to the yearnings of an oppressed people-and remind us that history does indeed make strange bedfellows.

Tensions of Empire

Since the events of the Second World War the relationship between Japan and Britain has undergone an extraordinary transformation, from bitter conflict to peaceful alliance. *Japan and Britain at War and Peace* is a multilayered examination of this bilateral relationship with an emphasis on the issue of reconciliation. Reconciliation is explored in a broad sense and in a number of areas from economic cooperation and conflict, common concerns in the international system, public and media perceptions of each country, and the efforts of individuals, non-governmental organizations and governments to promote mutual understanding and find strategies to deal with dilemmas. Mao's China and the Cold War

Corporate social responsibility (CSR) is a topical issue in many countries. What are the drivers for the global spread of explicit CSR – practices that are demonstrated to the outside – even in countries where companies had addressed CSR implicitly? What catalyzes organizations to adopt CSR and how does their adoption influence other companies' likelihood to adopt CSR? This book approaches the recent world-wide adoption of CSR practices as part of the global spread of management concepts. The trend to adopt CSR is examined among Japanese companies, because they have rapidly adopted CSR practices in the last two decades. Existing empirical research on CSR in Japan that has focused mainly on anecdotal evidence on a small number of outstanding companies is extended by employing both qualitative and quantitative empirical research methods. Analyzing drivers for the adoption of

CSR practices, organizational characteristics of adopting companies, and how increasing adoption influences the likelihood to adopt provides insights into how Japanese institutions and stakeholders facilitated rapid CSR adoption and the process of CSR diffusion.

A World in Flames

In recent years, Japan and Germany have been facing very similar challenges: aging populations, changing employment structures, long-lasting economic stagnation, and globalization, all of which threaten existing social security arrangements. Both countries are in a number of respects more socially and politically regulated, and in this sense less liberal, than the Anglo-American economies. Nonetheless, during the last couple of years several important social policy reforms have been implemented. A comparison of these reforms may provide valuable insights into the changing character of "conservative" welfare states. This volume concentrates on two fields of social policy: long-term care insurance and public pensions. These social insurances are at the center of current public debate in both countries because population aging translates immediately into a higher demand for care for the elderly and old age security. The contributions range from demographic and policy implications of aging through detailed analyses on the different reform measures to specific aspects such as bioethical or regional policy considerations. The volume is intended not only for experts specializing in social policy research but also for policy makers as well as the general reader interested in the current debates centering on the "restructuring of the welfare state".

Adoption of Corporate Social Responsibility by Japanese Companies

Environmental disasters or other large-scale disruptive events often trigger the emergence of social movements demanding social and/or political change. This study investigates mobilization processes at the meso level of the Japanese anti-nuclear movement after the nuclear disaster at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant caused by the Great East Japan Earthquake and subsequent tsunami waves on March 11, 2011. To capture such meso level movement dynamics – which so far have played only a minor role in research on social movement mobilization – the study presents an analytical model based on premises from political process theory, network theory, and relational sociology. This model is then applied to the case of the Japanese anti-nuclear movement after Fukushima by looking at the relational dynamics of two coalitional movement networks engaged in advocacy-related activities in TMkyM. The first case study is e-shift, a network-coalition working for nuclear phase-out and the promotion of renewable energy; the other is SHSK (ShienhM Shimin Kaigi), a coalition pushing for the rights of people affected by radioactive contamination and/or evacuation from contaminated areas. The study traces the mobilization processes of these two networks by analyzing data gathered in 2013 and 2014 in the form of participant observation of movement events, semi-structured interviews with movement organization representatives, and documentary data.

Networks and Mobilization Processes: The Case of the Japanese Anti-Nuclear Movement after Fukushima

By the spring of 1943, after the defeat at Stalingrad, the writing was on the wall. But while commanders close to the troops on Germany's various fronts were beginning to read it, those at the top were resolutely looking the other way. This seventh volume in the magisterial 10-volume series from the Militärgeschichtliches Forschungsamt [Research Institute for Military History] shows both Germany and her Japanese ally on the defensive, from 1943 into early 1945. It looks in depth at the strategic air war over the Reich and the mounting toll taken in the Battles of the Ruhr, Hamburg, and Berlin, and at the "Battle of the Radar Sets" so central to them all. The collapse of the Luftwaffe in its retaliatory

role led to hopes being pinned on the revolutionary V-weapons, whose dramatic but ultimately fruitless achievements are chronicled. The Luftwaffe's weakness in defence is seen during the Normandy invasion, Operation Overlord, an account of the planning, preparation and execution of which form the central part of this volume together with the landings in the south of France, the setback suffered at Arnhem, and the German counter-offensive in the Ardennes. The final part follows the fortunes of Germany's ally fighting in the Pacific, Burma, Thailand, and China, with American forces capturing islands ever closer to Japan's homeland, and culminates in her capitulation and the creation of a new postwar order in the Far East. The struggle between internal factions in the Japanese high command and imperial court is studied in detail, and highlights an interesting contrast with the intolerance of all dissent that typified the Nazi power structure. Based on meticulous research by MGFA's team of historians at Potsdam, this analysis of events is illustrated by a wealth of tables and maps covering aspects ranging from Germany's radar defence system and the targets of RAF Bomber Command and the US 8th Air Force, through the break-out from the Normandy beachhead, to the battles for Iwo Jima and Okinawa.

Japanese as Foreign Language in the Age of Globalization

Politically adrift, alienated from Weimar society, and fearful of competition from industrial elites and the working class alike, the independent artisans of interwar Germany were a particularly receptive audience for National Socialist ideology. As Hitler consolidated power, they emerged as an important Nazi constituency, drawn by the party's rejection of both capitalism and Bolshevism. Dieses Buch zeigt, wie das politische und militärische Bündnis zwischen Deutschland und Japan in der NS-Zeit kulturpolitisch flankiert wurde: in der Publizistik mit der Konstruktion vermeintlicher historischer und kultureller Gemeinsamkeiten zwischen beiden Ländern, u.a. zwischen Samurai und SS; mit der Produktion gemeinsamer Filme; mit Auftritten japanischer Künstler in Deutschland und dem

Ab 1938/39 wurden Pläne für eine weitere Intensivierung der Kulturbeziehungen durch die Kriege in Ostasien und Europa obsolet. Dafür versuchten in Deutschland jetzt Publizistik, Filme, Theater, Belletristik und sogar Konzertveranstalter und Komponisten, die Verbundenheit mit Japan lebendig zu erhalten und den Heroismus und Opfergeist japanischer Soldaten als vorbildlich darzustellen. Und noch Ende 1944 wurden bildungspolitische Vorbereitungen für eine von Deutschland und Japan dominierte Nachkriegswelt getroffen. Ein Schlusskapitel beschreibt, wie rasch die Wirkungen der nationalsozialistischen Japan-Propaganda nach 1945 verflohen und was aus ihren Protagonisten wurde.

European Union--the Second Founding

Das vorliegende Werk weist nach, dass die politische Struktur Japans im Zweiten Weltkrieg - etwa im Vergleich zu Deutschland - ein erstaunliches Maß an Pluralismus aufwies und es Persönlichkeiten, die über eine gewisse Prominenz verfügten, erlaubte, auch Kritik an offizieller Regierungspolitik und kompromissloser Kriegführung zu üben. Im Zentrum der Untersuchung steht nicht der militärische Ablauf, sondern das Streben nach Vermeidung eines bewaffneten Konfliktes 1941 und nach dessen Ausbruch die Suche nach einem Friedensschluss. Daran beteiligt waren u.a. einige der als Berater von Politik und Thron fungierenden ehemaligen Premierminister, inaktive und aktive Diplomaten, Militärs im Ruhestand, Journalisten, Kaiserliche Prinzen und Hofbeamte. Ein entscheidendes Motiv für ihre Aktivitäten war die Furcht vor einer kommunistischen Revolution im Falle einer militärischen Niederlage und damit dem Ende des TennM-Systems. Auch in den USA existierten Kräfte mit den gleichen Intentionen, und so ergänzten sich die Bestrebungen auf beiden Seiten des Pazifiks. Besonders die Furcht der USA vor einer Ausbreitung des Kommunismus in Fernost führte zu dem Interesse an einem konservativen Partner in dem Raum. Dadurch wurden Voraussetzungen geschaffen, trotz einer jahrelangen äußerst brutalen Kriegführung und einer misstrauischen Beäugung in den Anfangsjahren nach Japans Kapitulation den Weg zu einer Partnerschaft einzuschlagen, als deren Ergebnis Tokyo bis in die Gegenwart Washingtons wichtigste Stütze in Asien wurde.

The Second World War

Inhaltsangabe:Die vorliegende Arbeit untersucht die Reformierung des japanischen Bildungssystems durch die amerikanische Besatzungsmacht vom Zeitpunkt der Kapitulation Japans 1945 bis zum Abbruch des Gros der Reformbestrebungen im Jahre 1949. legen beschränkt werden? Gab es Widerstand gegen die Reformen der Besatzer von japanischer Seite und als wie erfolgreich kann dieser eingestuft werden? Kann folglich überhaupt von einer amerikanischen Demokratisierung Japans insbesondere im Bildungsbereich gesprochen werden? Konnten alle geplanten Reformen durchgeführt werden und waren diese Änderungen auch nachhaltig, d. h. auch nach Beendigung der Besatzung ab dem Jahre 1952 weiterhin in Kraft, um den Erhalt der mit der neuen Verfassung festgeschriebenen Demokratisierung des Landes langfristig zu sichern? Zur Klärung des vorangegangenen Fragenkataloges wurde das Werk wie folgt strukturiert: Leben und Werk des für diese Untersuchung wichtigsten Akteurs Joseph C. Trainor werden beleuchtet, bevor auf die Entwicklung der amerikanischen Nachkriegsplanungen unter besonderer Berücksichtigung der Nachkriegsgestaltungspläne der Japanexperten des U.S. State Departments eingegangen wird. Im Anschluss wird das erste Jahr der Besatzung in den Blick genommen. The Second World War

Die Fußball-Weltmeisterschaft in Südkorea und Japan 2002, der Besuch des japanischen Premierministers Koizumi in Pjöngjang im September des gleichen Jahres sowie die jüngsten Kontroversen um das nordkoreanische Nuklearprogramm haben das Verhältnis zwischen Japan und der koreanischen Halbinsel erneut ins Zentrum internationaler Aufmerksamkeit gerückt. Tapping Hitler's Generals

In den letzten Jahren mangelte es nicht an Versuchen, unsere Sicht auf Preußen und seine Geschichte zu revidieren. Die Autoren des vorliegenden Bandes haben sich vorgenommen, auch das Verhältnis Preußens (und des wilhelminischen Deutschlands) zu Japan neu zu beleuchten. Referaten, die im September 2000 auf einem Symposium im Japanisch-Deutschen Zentrum Berlin mit dem Thema „Japan und Preußen“ gehalten wurden.

Dieser Band bietet mit seiner gründlichen Einführung in die Historische Frauenforschung Japans und der Analyse eines ihrer Hauptwerke, der „Geschichte der Frau“ von Takamure Itsue (1894–1964), Ansätze und Material für eine international vergleichende Frauengeschichtsforschung und feministische Theorie. Gleichermäßen liefert er einen Beitrag zur Wissenschaftsgeschichte des modernen Japan. Takamure Itsue gilt als eine der wichtigsten AutorInnen der japanischen Frauengeschichtsforschung und ist zugleich eine innerhalb der japanischen Frauenbewegung und darüber hinaus politisch höchst kontrovers diskutierte Persönlichkeit. Erstmals werden mit diesem Band ihr Leben und Werk in Form einer Monographie in einer europäischen Sprache erschlossen.
