It is only when presented to the child for the first time in the form of stale knowledge and foregone conclusions that the facts taught in these lessons appear dry and repulsive to him. A short summary of the chief points in each reading lesson is given in the form of questions and answers. It is hoped that these reading lessons may afford intelligent teaching, even in the hands of a young teacher.
