start by lighting these first shapes

blend this first layer of light

painting the these shapes of light on his neck

add some yellow ochre some cadmium
paint with the tip of your brush
adding some carmine
adding a little bit of iron oxide
using that same warmer middle tone
keep in mind about the hues of the color
play by painting either with warmer tones or colder tones
adding this gray blue and gray green middle tones
proceed with the second light
try to reinforce this first light with brush strokes
proceed with painting the highlights
place them in a nice correct and convincing way on the face
add some egg solution
understand the consistency of your color
filling the the eyes with some light
use a little bit of highlight in the eyes
highlight the upper eyelids
underline some parts of the eyelids
highlight some of the darker areas
proceed with painting the hair
used some yellow ochre and a little bit of white

Agateware uses different coloured clays to create a pattern that imitates agate stone.

To make the moulds it is necessary to investigate how the original model used for the moulds was formed.

I'm throwing a thick shape that can be marked, carved and modelled into the main body of the teapot. I'm experimenting with how the form might have been originally made.

I'm marking the cast shell with a compass so I can model it to recreate the exact shape I need.

Ornamental relief on the lid and the finial is carved directly into the plaster moulds.

A slab of coloured clays needs to be created to press into the moulds.

an iron clay are layered with white earthenware to create the alternating layers.

The layered slabs are turned into rolls and cut.

The block is sliced into layers and pressed into a thick slab

A rolling pin is used to thin the slab.

Based on my research it became clear that the patterned slab of clay was sliced

I'm carefully pressing the patterned slab into the shell teapot mould...

The edges are scored in preparation to joining the two halves of the mould together.

A tool is used to seal the seams on the interior.

Now that the clay is leather-hard I'm removing it from the mould.

I'm going to clean the seams and assemble the sections to make the teapot.

The clay is rolled into a tapered coil to make the handle.

An incised plaster 'sprig mould' is used to create the eyes of the dolphin.

I'm piercing the holes that will let the tea flow from the body of the teapot into the spout.

I'll now leave the pot to dry before bisque firing.

After the bisque firing the teapot is dipped in glaze

When the glaze firing is complete the final colours are revealed.

details of decoration calculation of its dimensions and proportions.

Our vase-painter first produced a series of draft drawings and sketches before arriving at the final design

At the next stage we construct the vase body.

separately the cup and the stem, which were left to dry for 2 days before joining with wet clay.

This is the most vulnerable stage of construction.

To produce the ultra-fine clay slip natural ferruginous clays from Attica are soaked in water and processed.

Specific knowledge and experience are required both for the location of the appropriate clay deposit

The preparation process lasts up to one week

The areas that are due to become black are covered with the red clay paint

In the final stage, using an extra thin brush, the relief lines

16 hours later, the red clay paint is transformed to the black glaze

a golden metal leaf is then placed on top and fixed by burnishing.

6 people worked in total for the production of the vase and the preparation of the materials used.

The whole process lasted 7 weeks

25 hours for decoration and 60 hours for firing.

The work took place in October to November 2018
