Talking with the Dead

There exists the false belief that such after-death communications are rare, and that they may be indicative of the existence of psychological problems. Such knowledge might allow them to be comforted when they experience after death communication. It would help them share these experiences with others thus gaining support, as well as giving support to other bereaved family and friends.
