Handbuch ethische Bildung

Das Essen ist ein intimer Prozess, in dem wir die Umwelt zum Teil unseres Körpers werden lassen. Dennoch ist Ernährung nicht mehr allein eine Sache des persönlichen Geschmacks, denn bereits mit der Auswahl von Nahrungsmitteln wird ein (klima-)politisches Statement gesetzt. Die Frage ist, wie in der Erziehung von Kindern und Jugendlichen bestimmte Ideale rund um das Thema Ernährung vermittelt werden können. Dieses Buch begründet eine vegane Lebensweise als Widerstand gegen gesellschaftliche Mechanismen, in denen die Beziehungen zwischen Mensch und Tier von Gewalt geprägt sind und zu tiefgreifenden Verletzungen auf beiden Seiten führen. Gekoppelt mit einer kritischen Selbstreflexion, wird als Lösungsansatz eine Pädagogik des Mitgefühls vorgeschlagen, indem die menschliche Fähigkeit zur Empathie ein zentrales Element darstellt.

Gegen die Gewalt auf unserem Teller

Nur selten zuvor war es um Mensch-Tier-Verhältnisse derart schlecht bestellt wie in der Spätmoderne. Insbesondere die Potenzierung des Leidens durch die industrialisierte Landwirtschaft wirft zentrale Fragen der Tierethik auf - einem philosophischen Diskursfeld, das innerhalb der Human-Animal Studies von zentraler Bedeutung ist. Die in ihm miteinander im Wettstreit befindlichen Theorien strahlen zum einen direkt in die Gesellschaft aus, zum anderen begünstigen sie die Entwicklung neuer Sichtweisen auf Gegenstände der Kultur- und Literaturgeschichte. Dieser Grundlagenband versammelt Beiträge, welche das interdisziplinäre Forschungsfeld wissenschaftlich und didaktisch ausloten.

Tierethik transdisziplinär

Human beings are social beings and are involved in many social processes. Social philosophy is concerned with these different forms and structures of human coexistence. It inquires into persuasive interpretations of human beings in their relationship to social, political and cultural processes. This volume explains social-philosophy theories in these fields based on binaries - i.e., basic tensions in social philosophy. Central strands of theory are contrasted with one another, and at the same time important authors and works in the discipline are presented. The binaries present readers with the basic theoretical questions in social philosophy and enable the reader to develop well-founded own positions. The systematic reflections on the binaries are also clarified in relation to specific social developments.

Philosophie pluraler Gesellschaften

Der Theologe und Philosoph Albert Schweitzer machte der Philosophie seiner Zeit den Vorwurf, ihre Ethik auf das zwischenmenschliche Verhalten beschränkt zu haben. Aber nur eine Ethik, die das Verhalten des Menschen zu allen lebenden Wesen zum Inhalt habe, sei in der Lage, die Kultur tiefgreifend zu beeinflussen. Ausgangspunkt seiner Ethik der Ehrfurcht vor dem Leben ist die grundlegende Einsicht: "Ich bin Leben, das leben will, inmitten von Leben, das leben will." Angesichts von anthropogener Klimaerwärmung und Corona-Pandemie liegt die Aktualität des ethischen Ansatzes von Schweitzer auf der Hand. Patentrezepte gibt es allerdings auch mit Schweitzer nicht. Darum sind wir herausgefordert, die Problemlagen in unserer Zeit und Welt zu analysieren und im Geist der Ehrfurcht vor dem Leben Lösungsmöglichkeiten zu suchen. Der Band konzentriert sich auf die Landwirtschaft und die Tierhaltung – zwei elementare Lebensbereiche, wo gegenüber der bisherigen Praxis ein Umdenken und Umsteuern notwendig ist. [Albert Schweitzer's Ethics of Reverence for Life - Taking the Example of Species-appropriate Animal Husbandry and Ecological Agriculture] The theologian and philosopher Albert Schweitzer accused the philosophy of his time of having limited its ethics to interpersonal behavior. But only an ethics, which has the behavior of humans to all living beings in view, is able to affect the culture profoundly. The starting point of his ethics of reverence for life is the fundamental insight: "I am life that wants to live, in the midst of life that wants to live." In the face of anthropogenic global warming and corona pandemic, the topicality of Schweitzer's ethical approach is obvious. We are therefore challenged to analyze the problems of our time and world in a spirit of respect for life and to seek possible solutions. The volume focuses on agriculture and animal husbandry – two elementary areas of life where a rethinking and redirection is necessary as opposed to current practice.

Sind die Belange von Tieren von moralischer Bedeutung? Was dürfen wir mit Tieren tun, was nicht? Haben Tiere ein Recht auf Leben? Diese Einführung in die Tierethik widmet sich den zentralen Fragen der Tierethik: Sind Mensch und Tier moralisch gleich oder gibt es begründete Hierarchien? Die Einführung in die Tierethik entfaltet verschiedene Tierethiken und ordnet sie, so dass zugleich eine allgemeine Einführung in ethisches Argumentieren vorliegt. So kann ein tieferes Bewusstsein über die Beziehungen zu Tieren erlangt werden. Diese Einführung widmet sich grundlegend und strukturiert den Fragen der Tier-Mensch-Beziehung.

Es gehört mittlerweile zu unserer Alltagsmoral, dass zumindest jene Tiere, die uns etwas angehen, zu schützen sind. Auf der Grundlage dieses auch gesetzlich verankerten Common Sense ist die Auseinandersetzung mit der konkreten Verantwortung gegenüber Tieren in eine neue Phase gelangt: Stilprägend in der Tierschutzdebatte waren bislang Prinzipien, welche die Vermeidung von Leid, Schmerzen und Schäden zum Ziel hatten. Strategic Action for Animals

John Dewey stellt als Mitbegründer des Pragmatismus konkrete Probleme sozialer Realität programmatisch ins Zentrum seiner Philosophie. Diese Ausrichtung kommt dem Wunsch nach Praxisrelevanz der angewandten Ethik entgegen. Doch wie pragmatisch dürfen Ethiker sein? Herwig Grimm analysiert die Relevanz und die Reichweite der Theorie der Forschung von Dewey im Kontext der problem- und anwendungsorientierten Tierethik. Denn obwohl Dewey dafür plädiert, das Modell wissenschaftlicher Untersuchungen und ihre paradigmatische Methode, das Experiment, auf die Ethik zu übertragen, findet sich keine experimentelle Ethik in seinem umfangreichen Werk. Die grundlegende Frage dieser Arbeit ist deshalb, inwiefern Deweys Ansatz die angewandte Ethik und insbesondere die Tierethik auf ihrer Gratwanderung zwischen Praxisferne und Theorielosigkeit unterstützen kann. Hierauf gibt Das moralphilosophische Experiment eine Antwort.

Das Tier an sich

Resource-management decisions, especially in the area of protecting and maintaining biodiversity, are usually incremental, limited in time by the ability to forecast conditions and human needs, and the result of tradeoffs between conservation and other management goals. The individual decisions may not have a major effect but can have a cumulative major effect. Perspectives on Biodiversity reviews current understanding of the value of biodiversity and the methods that are useful in assessing that value in particular circumstances. It recommends and details a list of components-including diversity of species, genetic variability within and among species, distribution of species across the ecosystem, the aesthetic satisfaction derived from diversity, and the duty to preserve and protect biodiversity. The book also recommends that more information about the role of biodiversity in sustaining natural resources be gathered and summarized in ways useful to managers. Acknowledging that decisions about biodiversity are necessarily qualitative and change over time because of the nonmarket nature of so many of the values, the committee recommends periodic reviews of management decisions.

Protest Kitchen

The Inner World of Farm Animals

The challenges we face today are unprecedented, from the existential crisis of climate change to the global security threats posed by aggression in Ukraine and elsewhere. Add to this the crisis of liberal democracy and we seem to be swirling in a state of moral disarray, unsure whether there are any principles to which we can appeal today that would be anything other than particularistic. Beneath the Surface

Discusses in nontechnical language ten central questions about technology that illuminate what technology is and why it matters. Technology matters, writes David Nye, because it is inseparable from being human. We have used tools for more than 100,000 years, and their central purpose has not always been to provide necessities. People excel at using old tools to solve new problems and at inventing new tools for more elegant solutions to old tasks. Perhaps this is because we are intimate with devices and machines from an early age—as children, we play with technological toys: trucks, cars, stoves, telephones, model railroads, Playstations. Through these machines we imagine ourselves into a creative relationship with the world. As adults, we retain this technological playfulness with gadgets and appliances—Blackberries, cell phones, GPS navigation systems in our cars. We use technology to shape our world, yet we think little about the choices we are making. In *Technology Matters*, Nye tackles ten central questions about our relationship to technology, integrating a half-century of ideas about technology into ten cogent and concise chapters, with wide-ranging historical examples from many societies. He asks: Can we define technology? Does technology shape us, or do we shape it? Is technology inevitable or unpredictable? (Why do experts often fail to get it right?)? How do historians understand it? Are we using modern technology to create cultural uniformity, or diversity? To create abundance, or an ecological crisis? To destroy jobs or create new opportunities? Should "the market" choose our technologies? Do advanced technologies make us more secure, or escalate dangers? Does ubiquitous technology expand our mental horizons, or encapsulate us in artifice? These large questions may have no final answers yet, but we need to wrestle with them—to live them, so that we may, as Rilke puts it, "live along some distant day into the answers."

Moral Progress in Dark Times
