STRUCTURED Structured decisions, or programmable tasks, can be automated because a well-defined standard operating procedure exists for these types of decisions.

SEMISTRUCTURED Semistructured decisions are not quite as well defined by standard operating procedures, but they include a structured aspect that benefits from information retrieval, analytical models, and information systems technology.

OBJECTIVES Semistructured and unstructured decisions are challenging because they involve multiple criteria, and often users have to choose between conflicting objectives.

PHASES Herbert Simon, winner of the 1978 Nobel Prize in Economics, defines three phases in the decision- making process: intelligence, design, and choice. A fourth phase, implementation, can be added.

INTELLIGENCE In the intelligence phase, a decision maker (e.g., a marketing manager) examines the organization's environment for conditions that need decisions.

DESIGN In the design phase, the objective is to define criteria for the decision, generate alternatives for meeting the criteria, and define associations between the criteria and the alternatives.

CHOICE The choice phase is usually straightforward. From the practical alternatives, the best and most effective course of action is chosen.

IMPLEMENTATION In the implementation phase, the organization devises a plan for carrying out the alternative selected in the choice phase and obtains the resources to implement the plan.

process, and implement a decision-making task and can be considered a kind of intervention technology that helps overcome the limitations of group interactions.

SCOPE The success of a GSS depends on matching the GSS's level and sophistication to the group's size and the scope of the task.

GROUPWARE The goal of groupware is to assist groups in communicating, collaborating, and coordinating their activities. It is intended more for teamwork than for decision support.

TECHNIQUES A GIS uses spatial and nonspatial data and specialized techniques for storing coordinates of complex geographic objects.

ATTRIBUTES A GIS can associate spatial attributes, such as a manufacturing plant's square footage, with points, lines, and polygons on maps.

INFORMATION Examine the decision-making process that executives use to find out what kinds of decisions they are making and what kind of information they need to make these decisions.

COMMUNICATION This is important to ensure that key decision makers are involved in designing the MSS.

SIMPLICITY Avoid using technical jargon when explaining the system to executives because they might lose interest if they think the system is too technical.

CONSISTENCY Designers should use standard layouts, formats, and colors in windows, menus, and dialog boxes for consistency and ease of use.

FLEXIBILITY Almost all aspects of an MSS, including the user interface, change over time because of rapid developments in technology and the dynamic business environment.

FIRE's Guide to Free Speech on Campus

Before one can have the freedom to express ideas in open debate, however, one must have freedom of conscience: the right to arrive at one's private beliefs, without being coerced into an artificial unity by those who wield power over him/her. After all, the freedom to speak is a dead letter if one lacks the freedom to think, to believe, or to disbelieve. At the heart of American liberty lies a recognition of individual rights, individual responsibility, and individual dignity. Over one's inner mind, conscience, and self, no one has coercive power. The form of censorship with which this "Guide" is concerned is the affirmative form of censorship that goes beyond prohibiting "bad" speech and ideas. It instead seeks to impose on a student, and coerce the student to adopt, and to believe in, the "approved" point of

view advanced by the authorities. The fundamental rights of conscience and belief, the thought-reform programs that threaten those rights at today's universities, and the means by which a decent and free people can challenge such programs are the topics of this "Guide." (Contains 1 footnote.).

How the essential democratic values of diversity and free expression can coexist on campus. Safe spaces, trigger warnings, microaggressions, the disinvitation of speakers, demands to rename campus landmarks—debate over these issues began in lecture halls and on college quads but ended up on op-ed pages in the New York Times and the Wall Street Journal, on cable news, and on social media. Some of these critiques had merit, but others took a series of cheap shots at "crybullies" who needed to be coddled and protected from the real world. Few questioned the assumption that colleges must choose between free expression and diversity. In Safe Spaces, Brave Spaces, John Palfrey argues that the essential democratic values of diversity and free expression can, and should, coexist on campus. Palfrey, currently Head of School at Phillips Academy, Andover, and formerly Professor and Vice Dean at Harvard Law School, writes that free expression and diversity are more compatible than opposed. Free expression can serve everyone—even if it has at times been dominated by white, male, Christian, heterosexual, able-bodied citizens. Diversity is about self-expression, learning from one another, and working together across differences; it can encompass academic freedom without condoning hate speech. Palfrey proposes an innovative way to support both diversity and free expression on campus: creating safe spaces and brave spaces. In safe spaces, students can explore ideas and express themselves with without feeling marginalized. In brave spaces—classrooms, lecture halls, public forums—the search for knowledge is paramount, even if some discussions may make certain students uncomfortable. The strength of our democracy, says Palfrey, depends on a commitment to upholding both diversity and free expression, especially when it is hardest to do so.

Review of Regulatory Burden on the Upstream Petroleum (oil and Gas) Sector

The proposition of the thesis is, in its role as the lead offshore petroleum regulator in Ghana, the Petroleum Commission is not competent enough to oversee robust offshore health and safety regulation. Two accounts are developed to support this claim. First, the conferment of dual licensing and health and safety regulatory functions on the Petroleum Commission gives rise to a potential conflict. Secondly, even recognising a distinction between formal and de facto independence, neither is present in the Petroleum Commission. A number of factors justify these assertions: not least the fact that the law establishing the Petroleum Commission confers discretionary powers on the executive and does not provide regulatory independence as a formal requirement. In addition, the Commission's financial and administrative procedures are determinable by influences external to it. Formal independence is not, however, in itself a sufficient condition for the proper exercise of regulatory discretion. It is necessary for the regulatory body in question to be able in fact to behave independently, that is, to develop and take ownership of regulatory values, which in turn depend on the possession of relevant competence and expertise. Based on comparative analysis of global offshore regulatory regimes, and backed by empirical evidence, the thesis recommends legislative reforms in Ghana aimed at a functional separation of petroleum licensing from health and safety regulation.
