What are possible factors that are thought to contribute to MS? And does it run in families?

Do you have any recommendations as far as levels and amounts of Vitamin D? Or should they see their physician first?

Do you think there's any validity to inflammatory type diets and disease progression?

Talk to us a little bit about clinical trials and some of the things that happen here at UChicago Medicine in that realm. How important is that for MS patients?
