The Origin of Consciousness in the Breakdown of the Bicameral Mind

This volume offers an introduction to all questions of teaching Religious Education as a school subject and as an academic discipline related to this subject. An extensive catalogue includes illustrations showing the underlying geometries (in the form of incised "dead" drawings) from which the individual patterns are generated. An essay by Mohammad al-Asad discusses the geometry of the muqarnas and demonstrates by means of CAD drawings how one of the scroll's patterns could be used co design a three-dimensional vault.

Contemporary Bioethics

Islamophobia can be defined as the fear of or prejudiced viewpoint towards Islam, Muslims and matters pertaining to them.
