Oscar Wilde in Deutschland und Österreich

Im Netz der Texte

Die Annäherung an Paul Celans Übersetzungspoetik erfolgt in diesem Buch aus drei Blickrichtungen. Das Übersetzerische Verfahren wird zunächst ausgehend von Theorien des lyrischen Ich als ›Transfer

der Aussagestruktur« definiert. Darauf aufbauend wird Celans übersetzerische Produktion in den Kontext seiner eigenen Poetik des Dialogs gestellt. Eine Übersetzungspoetik verfasste Celan zwar nie, jedoch lässt sich eine solche aus anderen poetologischen Schriften wie dem »Meridian« erschließen. Der größte Teil der Studie aber gilt den Übertragungen französischer Lyriker, von dem Surrealisten Benjamin Péret (»Surrealistische Publikationen«, 1950) bis André du Bouchet (»Vakante Glut«, 1968). Neben den sehr bekannten Übertragungen von Rimbauds »Bateau ivre« (1958) und Valéry's »Jeune Parque« (1960) werden auch die bislang kaum beachteten Apollinaire- und Supervielle-Übersetzungen (1951–1959 und 1958–1968) untersucht. Insbesondere an diesen beiden Gruppen von Übertragungen lässt sich zeigen, wie sich Celans Übersetzungspoetik im Laufe der Jahre wandelte: Bis etwa 1960 werden im Übersetzungswerk in wachsendem Maße die gleichen Stilmittel eingesetzt wie in den eigenen Gedichten; in den sechziger Jahren hingegen emanzipieren sich die Übertragungen von der Poetik der eigenen Dichtung und werden wieder »wörtlicher«, dem Original »getreuer«. Diesen späten Wandel im Umgang mit dem fremden Text erläutert die Verfasserin am Ende ihrer Studie als Konsequenz eines bisher unbeachtet gebliebenen Widerspruchs in Celans Poetik des Dialogs.

Must - Pop

Nicht nur die Literatur bringt Räume hervor, auch Räume können über Jahrhunderte hinweg neue literarische Narrative erzeugen. In Konzeptualisierungen der Hucul's yna in der polnischen, ukrainischen und österreichischen Literatur des 19. und 20. Jahrhunderts - als Heimat der Edlen Wilden, Schmiede von Nationalhelden, verlorenes Paradies, Nabel der Welt, neues Hellas, Ursprung des Erzählens - spielen die Elemente der kulturellen Energie der Ostkarpaten (Beschaffenheit der Landschaft, Verbundenheit zwischen Mensch und Natur, religiöser Synkretismus, Topoi der oralen Tradition, Mehrsprachigkeit und materielle Kultur) eine zentrale Rolle. Unter Einbezug der Diskussionen um den spatial turn, die Mitteleuropa-Debatte sowie die Regionalisierungsprozesse im heutigen Europa werden zahlreiche literarische Texte analysiert.

Die hybride Gattung

Die griechisch-römische Antike ist seit etwa einem Jahrzehnt wieder ein zentraler Bezugspunkt kultureller Rezeption und Repräsentation: so im Theater und im Film, in Ausstellungen und allen voran in der Literatur. Daß dabei vor allem die antiken Mythen Interesse finden, liegt nicht zuletzt daran, daß die Antike selbst zum posthumanistischen Mythos geworden ist. An einem umfangreichen Textkorpus aus der englischsprachigen Gegenwartslyrik erkundet die vorliegende Studie Voraussetzungen und Ausprägungen einer neuen Mythopoetik, die zur Grundlage das Ende des Humanismus und dessen poetische Aufarbeitung hat. Lektüren zentraler lyrischer Texte von 1970 bis heute, u.a. von Tony Harrison, Derek Walcott und Eavan Boland, verbinden sich mit einer breit angelegten Analyse des Statuswandels der Antike in der englischsprachigen Welt zur ersten umfassenden Untersuchung zeitgenössischer literarischer Antikerezeption.

Paul Celans Übersetzungspoetik

In der 1968 gegründeten Reihe erscheinen Monographien aus den Gebieten der Griechischen und Lateinischen Philologie sowie der Alten Geschichte. Die Bände weisen eine große Vielzahl von Themen auf: neben sprachlichen, textkritischen oder gattungsgeschichtlichen philologischen Untersuchungen stehen sozial-, politik-, finanz- und kulturgeschichtliche Arbeiten aus der Klassischen Antike und der Spätantike. Entscheidend für die Aufnahme ist die Qualität einer Arbeit; besonderen Wert legen die Herausgeber auf eine umfassende Heranziehung der einschlägigen Texte und Quellen und deren sorgfältige kritische Auswertung.

Das ästhetische Kalkül von Friedrich Nietzsches Also sprach Zarathustra

Das Literaturwissenschaftliche Jahrbuch wurde 1926 von Günther Müller gegründet. Beabsichtigt war, in dieser Publikation regelmäßig einen Überblick über neue Forschungsvorhaben und Ergebnisse zu bieten. Darüber hinaus enthielt das Jahrbuch auch Primärliteratur. 1939 verboten die Nationalsozialisten das Periodikum. Eine Neue Folge wurde im Jahre 1960 unter der Ägide des Germanisten Hermann Kunisch begründet, die inzwischen auf nunmehr 35 Bände gediehen ist. In der fächerübergreifenden Zeitschrift werden Beiträge zur Germanistik, Anglistik/Amerikanistik und Romanistik auf Deutsch und in den zu den Fächern gehörenden Sprachen publiziert. Außerdem enthält sie einen umfangreichen Besprechungsteil. Das Literaturwissenschaftliche Jahrbuch ist auf keine Methode festgelegt. Die

Herausgeber streben an, auch Beiträge junger Nachwuchswissenschaftler aufzunehmen. Zu seinen Besonderheiten gehört darüber hinaus, bislang unveröffentlichte literarische Texte zu publizieren.

Der Raum und seine Texte

In seinem Bürgerkriegsepos fikionalisiert Lucan den historischen Stoff in einer intensiven literarischen Auseinandersetzung mit seinen Vorgängern, die bisher meist anhand seines Verhältnisses zur Geschichtsschreibung und zur römischen Epik untersucht worden ist. Die vorliegende Studie schließt eine Lücke der Lucan-Forschung, indem sie den Blick über die Sprach- und Gattungsgrenzen hinweg auf die Rezeption der griechischen Literatur richtet, insbesondere der attischen Tragödie und der hellenistischen Dichtung. Am Beispiel ausgewählter Passagen wird die Bedeutung von mythisch-literarischen Modellen wie dem Troianischen Krieg und dem Bruderkrieg um Theben für Lucans epische Gestaltung des Bürgerkriegsthemas aufgezeigt. Mittels intertextueller und narratologischer Analysen wird die Adaptation und Transformation der griechischen Prätexte untersucht, die im *Bellum civile* sowohl direkt als auch in der Vermittlung über lateinische Texte, etwa die Tragödien Senecas, rezipiert sind. Dabei soll auch der Frage nachgegangen werden, in welcher Weise in unterschiedlichen historischen und gesellschaftlichen Kontexten der antiken Kultur Kriego- und Bürgerkriegserfahrungen im Medium des Mythos und der Dichtung gespiegelt werden.

Antike Mythen - Mythos Antike

Ovid nimmt zwischen 1660 und 1800, einer Zeit, die von zwei großen Diskontinuitäten in der episteme der abendländischen Kultur geprägt ist, in England eine Sonderstellung ein. Er gehört zwar zu den antiken Autoren, die generell im Klassizismus in England höchstes Ansehen genießen, doch entsprechen seine Metamorphosen nicht den Normen im Sinne des klassizistischen Verständnisses von antiken Texten. Diese Studie erforscht erstmals differenziert, wie mit diesem europäischen Grundtext verfahren wurde und zeigt, wie er in andere Gattungen verschoben, parodiert und imitiert wurde, dass bestimmte Mythen selektiert und Ausgaben für ganz bestimmte Lesergruppen erstellt wurden. Sie etabliert damit erstmals Ovids Metamorphosen als hochinteressanten «Testtext», um eine diversifizierte und durch ganz unterschiedliche Diskurse und Kanäle literarischer Produktion und Rezeption geprägte Zeit zu erhellen.

Kultur und Übersetzung

Im Oktober 1997 fand, zum Gedenken an den Geburtstag von Martin Opitz am 23.12.1597, ein Kolloquium in Görlitz statt, mit einem internationalen und auch interdisziplinären Teilnehmerkreis. Die Tagung, deren Referate hier vorgelegt werden, versuchte ihrem Anlaß gemäß, ein Gesamtbild von Opitzens Wirken in seiner Zeit vorzustellen. Sie ging dabei von einer Konzeption der "Lebenswelt" aus, »als einer wahrgenommenen Wirklichkeit, in der soziale Gruppen und Individuen sich verhalten und durch ihr Denken und Handeln wiederum Wirklichkeit produzieren« (Rudolf Vierhaus). Im Kontext der Frühen Neuzeit vollzieht sich eine solche Wirklichkeitskonstruktion allerdings in genau zu umschreibenden Textsorten, die durch traditionale und normative Vorgaben strukturiert sind. Die Text- und Wahrnehmungsmuster sind dabei selbst gerade nicht an Konzepten des "Wirklichen" oder "Authentischen" verknüpft.

Das Satirische in Juvenals Satiren

Band 1 der auf drei Bände angelegten Schriften des Komparatisten und Goethe-Forschers Hendrik Birus. Die "Gesammelten Schriften" des Münchener Literaturwissenschaftlers Hendrik Birus werden in drei Bänden dessen weltweit verstreut erschienene Vorträge und Abhandlungen aus den Jahren 1980 bis 2020 enthalten und eine Summe seines wissenschaftlichen Schaffens ziehen. Der nun vorliegende erste Band enthält thematisch geordnet seine Untersuchungen zur Allgemeinen und Vergleichenden Literaturwissenschaft im Spannungsfeld von Philologie und Philosophie. Die Bände 2 und 3 werden 2021 erscheinen. Die Studien in Band 2 beschäftigen sich vor allem mit der deutschen Literatur von Lessing bis Celan aus komparatistischer Sicht, Band 3 wird Birus' Goethe-Studien enthalten.

Literaturwissenschaftliches Jahrbuch. N.F., 35.1994
