The process is called smelting.

Although people used bronze to make lots of different things, the Bronze Age is the time

Let's go back in time to find out how people in the Bronze Age turned this into tools like this.

First the shape of the axehead is created in wax.

Next the wax is covered with clay to create a mould.

Then the copper and tin are ground up.

The ground-up pieces are placed in a pot over the fire and heated up.

The clay mould is then heated over a fire to make the clay hard.

As the wax melts, it leaves a hollow axe shape inside the mould.

The hollow mould is placed in the ground to keep it steady.

A clay top is placed in the mould.

The copper and tin have now melted and mixed together to form bronze. It is extremely hot.

The liquid metal is poured into the mould and left to cool and harden.

The clay mould is broken away to reveal the bronze axe inside.
