Traducción E Interculturalidad

La selección de poemas que componen este volumen es el tributo que el traductor Ronaldo Costa Picazo rinde a Jack Kerouac. Ya nadie discute que, en su papel de icono como rebelde, Kerouac encabezó la última vanguardia del siglo XX, y que su obra inició una etapa revisionista del canon literario y abrió las puertas a la obra de minorías. Los poemas de Mexico City Blues, escritos entre agosto y los primeros días de septiembre de 1955, fueron compuestos bajo la influencia de la marihuana y de la morfina. Autor de "En el camino", "Ángeles de desolación", "Los subterráneos", entre otros, Kerouac es, junto con William S. Burroughs y Allen Ginsberg, uno de los personajes más influyentes de la llamada Generación Beat que surgió en Estados Unidos a finales de la década del '40. "No sabía a donde ir excepto a todas partes" fue el ritmo en el que Kerouac, como su frase, supo y pudo vivir su vida a pesar de la muerte.

món), també ho és que, contra tots els pronòstics, després de la segona guerra mundial, s'ha produït un nou «reencantament del món», que engloba un camp ampli de significats i fronteres incertes. Aquesta proliferació de pràctiques, creences i imaginaris ha rebut diferents denominacions, com per exemple Nova Era o New Age, àmbit difús del místic o espiritualitats emergents, o nebulosa místicoesotèrica. Nosaltres hem optat per denominar-ho Nous Imaginaris Culturals.

Jack Kerouac

Este libro es una indagación sobre Jack Kerouac, el escritor al que toda una generación erigió en portavoz a su pesar. Duval da voz a personajes clave de aquellos años: el poeta Allen Ginsberg; Carolyn Cassady, mujer de Neal Cassady y amante de Kerouac; Joyce Johnson, que mantenía una relación sentimental con el escritor cuando le llegó la fama; Timothy Leary, gurú de la psicodelia en los sesenta; Anne Waldman, poeta beat; y Ken Kesey, personaje central de la contracultura norteamericana. A través de ellos indagamos, en primer lugar, el misterio de Jack Kerouac, ese tipo que escribió la novela más emblemática de su generación para luego caer en el alcoholismo y la desolación. Els nous imaginaris culturals

Desde las primeras décadas del siglo xx, la ciudad de Buenos Aires fue un centro de atracción para quienes no encajaban en los rígidos patrones de la heteronormatividad ambiente. Sin embargo, fue a partir de la década de 1950 cuando el espacio urbano porteño se convirtió en un auténtico foco de disidencia, una cartografía abundante en puntos de encuentro y socialización para aquellos varones que deseaban a otros varones. La ciudad amoral propone un recorrido por la obra de dos autores -Renato Pellegrini y Carlos Correas- que, al dar cuenta de esos espacios en novelas y relatos, contribuyeron a crear, a su vez, un espacio literario hasta entonces inexistente en las letras

argentinas. Desplazando la retórica ambigua que había sido dominante hasta aquel momento, Correas y Pellegrini inauguraron nuevos cauces de la ficción disidente. En sus textos, Buenos Aires se articula como escenario de vigilancia y control de lo diferente, pero también de transgresiones y fugas de lo establecido.

Estados Unidos y América Latina

Este estudio constituye el primer acercamiento crítico, en el mundo académico hispano, a las poetisas y artistas de la generación Beat que, junto con los componentes masculinos bien conocidos del grupo (Kerouac, Ginsberg, Burroughs) revolucionaron la escena literaria urbana en la década de los cincuenta en los Estados Unidos, adelantándose así al cambio de mentalidad que colonizó el mundo en los sesenta y los setenta. 'Female Beatness' ubica en el canon literario y el devenir histórico a las mujeres que participaron de la efervescencia del excepcional momento creativo Beat y rompieron las barreras, con sus vivencias y sus obras, del papel subsidiario para el que a priori habían sido educadas. Dentro de un enfoque amplio que aúna contexto socio-histórico, teorías de género y análisis textual, el libro pone en el punto de mira a las poetisas Elise Cowen, Diane di Prima, Ruth Eiss y Denise Levertov, explorando de este modo todas las formas posibles, muy diferentes entre sí, de ser Beat... en femenino. Hoy día, más de medio siglo después, su influencia y predicamento siguen absolutamente vigentes.

El 17 de diciembre de 1950 Neal Cassady escribió a Jack Kerouac una carta que impresionó a este hasta el punto de modificar su estilo narrativo. Cassady le cuenta en ella la aventura que había tenido cinco años antes con una muchacha llamada Joan Anderson, y entre bromas y veras salpica el relato con multitud de anécdotas, opiniones, descripciones y juegos verbales. Kerouac se fijó sobre todo en la desenvoltura y frescura con que su amigo contaba las cosas, en su mezcla de golfería y sensibilidad literaria, en la facilidad con que improvisaba e introducía digresiones y, en definitiva, en la libertad narrativa que reflejaba. Un año antes Kerouac y él habían recorrido el país y vivido una serie de experiencias que el primero se disponía a contar con el puntillismo naturalista que había aprendido de Thomas Wolfe y plasmado en su primera novela, *La ciudad y el campo*, que acababa de publicarse aquel mismo año. Pero leer la carta lo cambió todo. Un año después, Kerouac visitó a Cassady, se instaló en su casa y se puso a escribir las aventuras del viaje de 1949 con un estilo nuevo y espontáneo que según él había concebido al leer la célebre carta de Joan Anderson. Así nació la siguiente novela de Kerouac, *En el camino*, y amaneció una nueva etapa en la historia de la literatura norteamericana.
