Volume 1 of Bruner's commentary is called *The Christbook* because the first twelve chapters of Matthew are focused on the nature and work of Christ. As Bruner proceeds through these chapters, he shows how Matthew presents, step by step, central themes of Christology: Jesus' coming (chapters 1-4), his teaching (5-7), his miracles (8-9), his sermon on mission (10), and his person (11-12). Throughout the book there are also thoughtful discussions of significant topics such as baptism, marriage, Jewish-Christian relations, and heaven and hell. This book addresses a central issue confronting the reader of the Gospel. How do Christians go about understanding their cultural context in twenty-first century Britain? What is the relationship between faith and the culture in which it is lived? But far from faulting teens, Dean places the blame for this theological watering down squarely on the churches themselves. In order to produce ardent young Christians, Dean argues, churches must rediscover their sense of mission and model an understanding of being Christian as not something you do for yourself, but something that calls you to share God's love, in word and deed, with others. Dean found that the most committed young Christians shared four important traits: they could tell a personal and powerful story about God; they belonged to a significant faith community; they exhibited a sense of vocation; and they possessed a profound sense of hope. Based on these findings, Dean proposes an approach to Christian education that places the idea of mission at its core and offers a wealth of concrete suggestions for inspiring teens to live more authentically engaged Christian lives. Persuasively and accessibly written, *Almost Christian* is a wake up call no one concerned about the future of Christianity in America can afford to ignore.

Freedom All The Way Up proposes four intertwined elements that make up the meaning of life—self-worth, purpose, identity, and hope. Materialism (atheism) claim the universe has no meaning, so there is no larger purposeful story into which we can place ourselves—we are left on our own to construct meaning for our lives. Barrigar argues, though, that the universe possess God's meaning and purpose—to provide the space and conditions by which to bring about the existence of agape-capable beings in agape-loving relationships with God and with others. freedom, which focuses principally on self, and agapic freedom, which focuses principally on God and on others. Materialism chooses autonomous freedom, but thereby introduces nihilism into each of the elements of meaning. It turns out that nihilism is a much greater problem for Materialism than suffering is for Theism. In contrast, agapic freedom infuses self-worth, purpose, identity, and hope with God's agape-love, dispelling Materialism's inherent nihilism. *Freedom All The Way Up* provides a dramatic new proposal for God and the meaning of life in our scientific and humanist age.

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Aproximación al Jesús histórico

¿Es verdad que Jesús nunca existió como muchos afirman? A lo largo del libro el lector percibirá cómo utilizando científicamente los métodos que se describen en él, y observando los ejemplos ilustrativos, es posible aproximarse históricamente a la figura de Jesús de Nazaret. Este libro sirve además de ayuda e introducción al estudio concreto de los evangelios, de modo que se consiga tener una noción suficientemente clara de su valor literario e histórico y de las razones de ello. El Jesús histórico. Otras aproximaciones

Poner a disposición del público un panorama breve pero bastante completo de lo que se está escribiendo en lengua española en estos momentos es pues la finalidad de estas Otras aproximaciones. Este panorama se divide consecuentemente en dos secciones. La primera contiene apreciaciones positivas y negativas respecto a las obras sobre Jesús de autores confesionales, es decir, dependientes de la fe de una iglesia determinada. La segunda ofrece por medio de análisis históricos otras aproximaciones al personaje que el autor defiende como más cercanas a la figura histórica de este y que no dependen de iglesia alguna. Ahora bien, también esta segunda parte es crítica. Se trata de construir una imagen de Jesús sobre la base de lo que razonablemente podemos saber hoy acerca de él utilizando todas las herramientas usuales en la investigación de la historia antigua. La lista de libros comentados no es muy grande teniendo en cuenta que sobre Jesús se escriben cerca de mil libros al año, aunque la mayoría sin valor histórico alguno. Con los libros aquí presentados cree el autor que tiene ya el lector suficientes herramientas intelectuales para formarse una idea de cómo debe discurrir hoy día la investigación del Jesús de la historia. La imagen del Nazareno obtenida de este conjunto crítico está escrita con la consciencia plena de que su vida, aun siendo la de un personaje históricamente remoto, está totalmente viva en la inmensa mayoría de los cristianos. Por ello, esa vida sigue interesando por sí misma.

El enviado del Reino

Esta obra presenta la faceta histórica de Jesús de Nazaret, un tema controvertido situado en el centro de la cultura religiosa occidental. Muestra al lector no especializado los logros de la investigación contemporánea acerca del profeta galileo y mesías cristiano y, para ello, se apoya en el trabajo de autores de diferentes perspectivas conceptuales y teológicas. En el campo del saber histórico, la recuperación de la figura de Jesús de Nazaret ha sido el resultado de una lectura crítica de los relatos evangélicos, entendidos en el marco de las tradiciones judías y helenistas de la antigüedad, y de la búsqueda en ellos, con criterios de autenticidad, del estrato más cercano a la realidad de su vida, en el Israel del siglo I de nuestra era durante la hegemonía de la civilización grecorromana. El libro examina temas centrales de la aproximación histórica a la imagen de Jesús: los orígenes de la investigación moderna en la época de la Ilustración; la predicación del reinado de Dios; la autenticidad y fidelidad de las fuentes escritas; su imagen judeo-galilea como hombre santo carismático y profeta apocalíptico; su ajusticiamiento como sedicioso y la degradación romana de la causa mesiánica; los relatos acerca de la creencia en su resurrección y, para concluir, se acerca a Jesús en sus propias palabras. A través de relatos, análisis y comparaciones de textos de antiguas tradiciones el lector puede acceder a una visión actual acerca del bautizo y la familia de Jesús, los autores de los evangelios y sus manuscritos más antiguos, el descubrimiento arqueológico de los rollos de Qumrán, la antigua religión sacrificial judía, la rebelión contra Roma, la destrucción del Templo de Jerusalén y la catástrofe colectiva que representó para la nación judía, así como a las religiones que la sobrevivieron, el judaísmo rabínico y el judaísmo nazareno, cuyos seguidores llegaron a ser llamados cristianos.

Aproximación a la historia de la lingüística

"Los árboles pueden ocultar el bosque". Aproximación histórica a los Comentarios reales

Con una perspectiva interdisciplinar, se estudian tanto la escasa sociabilidad institucionalizada de las elites como, particularmente, aquella otra informal en la que se produjo este complejo proceso de formación de una nueva clase dirigente nacida del encuentro entre la vieja aristocracia y la nueva burguesía.
