EXPLAINING THE GROWTH OF BUREAUCRACY

BEHAVIOR Bureaucratic behavior is assumed to follow the intent of the legislature in the form of legislative enactments and guidelines for implementation.

DIRECTION Bureaucracy relies on the legislature for substantive policy direction and for financial and political support. The legislature, in turn, looks to the bureaucracy for faithful and competent administration of the laws.

INTENT Legislative intent describes the goals, purposes, and objectives of a legislative body. Bureaucracies are assumed to follow legislative intent in implementing law.

SUBORDINATE The legislature is expected to supervise the work of the bureaucracy. Bureaucracy is distinctly subordinate to the will and initiative of other parts of the government

OVERSIGHT Legislative oversight the process by which a legislative body supervises the work of the bureaucracy in order to ensure its conformity with legislative intent

SPECIALISTS It was traditionally assumed that the bureaucracy would be a neutral, professional, competent structure staffed by specialists in both general administrative processes and their respective specific policy areas.
