He posits that the very possibility of coherent inner experience and self-awareness necessitates the existence of outer objects in space and time, thereby grounding the philosophy of reality within the structure of our understanding. This complex position refutes dogmatic idealism while affirming the reality of the world as we experience it.

A concept is a rule guiding synthesis; wherever there is synthesis there must be a concept telling us how to perform the synthesis.

The perception of any stretch of space or time requires an act of synthesis on the part of the mind.
