You know what is indeed sweet like a rose?

Personal name sign is one of some cultural aspects of the Deaf community.

Virtually each member of the Deaf community has their unique name sign.

My own is the handshapet tapped on the forehead.

Name sign is a traditional part of the Deaf culture very similar to name giving in American Natives.

It does not quite follow the natural system of rules.

Most likely my teacher was a hearing teacher.

What is off about my own name sign?

Name signs are not to block the face.

Another example is the location.

You will not find an ASL name dictionary where you can look up a personal name. That is not how it works.

All personal names use fingerspelling.

A culturally Deaf person may create a name sign to a new non-native hearing member of the community

It is a gift given and not something that a non-native or hearing person can make up or invent for oneself

For each of my students at the start of the school year

I often tell them to purchase a cake mix of their choice or have a favorite recipe handy.

And to wait very patiently! To wait very meekly. To work hard on their ASL and wait....

The special day that they receive a name sign welcoming them into the Deaf community.

Unlike birth names on their certificate, a sign name can be changed once or so in a person's lifetime for some reason

Today the white strip is no longer noticeable with my full head of grey

Regardless, the name sign will most likely remain unless the Deaf community changes it.

There are two types of name signs given.

Descriptive name signs are based on a physical characteristic or behavior that tends to exemplify that person.

My friend Sandy has a great sense of humor with a bubbly temperament.

Some people have a combination of initialized and descriptive name signs.

Mark (always a buzz cut)

Not everyone affiliated with the Deaf community has a name sign, even if they've lived within it their entire lives

It is not a requirement and some people just prefer to use their given name.

Unlike English names, name signs are not commonly given at birth since most Deaf children have hearing parents.

They are naturally given an English name that is put on their birth certificate but...

Typically it is only later when the child is among other Deaf people that they are given a name sign - usually by their peers or a well-respected

I hope this helps you understand how vital it is to recognize the history, the values, and the traditions behind giving and receiving name signs.

We want to be true to that history by respecting the values behind ASL naming.

For those who are waiting for their name sign. Be patient my friend. Work
