Nella Londra novecentesca fra le due guerre, una strana figura d'artista fa il vuoto intorno a sé. Si chiama Wyndham Lewis e ha fondato una rivista che non ha collaboratori e espone un unico pensiero: il suo. Le ha dato come titolo The Enemy, "Il Nemico", ed è quello che lui vuole essere, un fuorilegge solitario e un proscritto rispetto allo establishment e alle mode del suo tempo. Divenuto il più grande ritrattista della sua generazione, gli anni Trenta lo vedranno ingaggiare, sempre in perfetta solitudine, una battaglia contro i "compagni di strada" e la sinistra intellettuale inglese che fliltra con il bolscevismo sovietico. In esilio volontario in Canada durante la Seconda guerra mondiale, Lewis tornerà in seguito in patria riprendendo la sua posizione di outsider e di proscritto rispetto all'ordine costituito. Come critico d'arte sarà il primo a intuire il genio di Francis Bacon, ma, ironia del destino per chi come lui aveva fatto dell'"Occhio" la sua ragione estetica, trascorrerà l'ultimo decennio della sua vita nella più completa cecità.

## Genio ribelle

First published in Germany in 1929, The End and the Beginning is a lively personal memoir of a vanished world and of a rebellious, high-spirited young woman's struggle to achieve independence. Born in 1883 into a distinguished and wealthy aristocratic family of the old Austro-Hungarian Empire, Hermynia Zur Muhlen spent much of her childhood travelling in Europe and North Africa with her diplomat father. After five years on her German husband's estate in czarist Russia she broke with both her family and her husband and set out on a precarious career as a professional writer committed to socialism. Besides translating many leading contemporary authors, notably Upton Sinclair, into German, she herself published an impressive number of politically engaged novels, detective stories, short stories, and children's fairy tales. Because of her outspoken opposition to National Socialism, she had to flee her native Austria in 1938 and seek refuge in England, where she died, virtually penniless, in 1951. This revised and corrected translation of Zur Muhlen's memoir - with extensive notes and an essay on the author by Lionel Gossman - will appeal especially to readers interested in women's history, the Central European aristocratic world that came to an end with the First World War, and the culture and politics of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.
