Take a look at Norway...

Vikings from Norway settled in Orkney and around Northwest Scotland from the late 8th century. Evidence of this movement of Norse Vikings into northern Britain remains in British genomes today.

The ancestry of the genetic cluster in Orkney shows the most substantial

These patterns reflect Norse Viking migrations into the region.

Now let's look at Germany...

This genetic group covers an area closely corresponding to Old Saxony, home of the Saxons.

The Saxons invaded Britain in the 5th century and many settled here.

The characteristic genetic signatures of the UK groups match this Saxon invasion remarkably closely The genomes of all 17 clusters show significant shared ancestry with these European groups This suggests that the shared ancestry is old, and that DNA from these European regions spread throughout Britain a long time ago

Wales shows more ancestry reflective of these earliest settlers to Britain than England Linguistic, historical and archaeological evidence had led some scholars to believe the Saxons replaced the majority of the population in England
