Milton Keynes didn't exist at this point. Well at least not as it is now. The city was part of a new development project in the 1960s. Before that the area was mostly farmland with very small population. It was inhabited ever since the bronze age it just never was an established city or even a town until the 1960s. I put it in because I simply made a mistake.

This could have been more than three or even less, it's hard to prove where one was born in the 12th century. Not many birth certificates were printed out at that time.

Technically he was only a "master of the scholars" since the chancellery didn't exist yet but in practice he basically oversaw all the day to day administrations of the University just like a chancellor would. Another reason for staying may have been that Cambridge had a presence of ecclesiastical courts for the bishopric of Ely meaning students and specially law students would have had a great opportunity to work in the town as well as learn.
