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Umanità e stile di Corrado Alvaro

Secondo un noto adagio, la mela non cade mai lontano dall'albero, ossia un figlio assomiglia sempre ai suoi genitori. Ma i bambini descritti in questo libro sono mele cadute altrove, in un altro frutteto, a volte in un altro mondo. Sono sordi o nani, affetti da sindrome di Down, autismo, schizofrenia o molteplici gravi disabilità; sono bambini prodigio, bambini concepiti in uno stupro o che commettono reati, sono transgender. Eppure, le loro famiglie, spesso accomunate da un profondo senso di isolamento, imparano a tollerare, accogliere e infine a essere orgogliose di figli tanto diversi. Giorno dopo giorno, questi genitori cercano di rispondere a una domanda cruciale: fino a che punto è possibile accettare i figli per quello che sono, aiutandoli, magari anche contro le proprie aspettative e i propri desideri, a trovare la loro autentica identità? Attingendo a quarantamila pagine di trascrizioni di interviste condotte con oltre trecento famiglie, Andrew Solomon esplora l'universo della diversità e della sofferenza, in un racconto corale in cui si intrecciano le molteplici esperienze di persone normali poste di fronte a sfide eccezionali. Che si tratti di impianti cocleari per sordi, di allungamento degli arti per bambini affetti da nanismo, di interventi chirurgici di riassegnazione del sesso, l'approdo finale di questo viaggio nella differenza è la conquista della compassione. arricchite in modi che non avrebbero mai immaginato.
