For Me I Think Especially of a Quote from John Adams That I First Encountered in Bernhard Baylin's Ideological Origins of the American Revolution That the True Revolution Was in the Hearts and Minds of the People and What Better Way To Convey that Sense of National Identity that Revolution Then through Cartographic Images that Being Said I'M Not Going To Show You a Map Today I Don't Want To Talk about a Specific Map I Want To Talk about a Surveying Process and How the Map Was Constructed and More Importantly for Me How It Is Being Remembered by Historians or the Stories We Tell Ourselves about the Construction of these Images That Are Images of a New Nation The Other Individual Is Ferdinand Hassler Who Will End Up Actually Directing the Coastal Survey Born in Switzerland He Works for a Swiss Trigonometric Survey before He Comes to the United States and Is a Lecturer in Mathematics at the US Military Academy at West Point and When this Call for a Survey Comes Out His Good Friend Albert Gallatin Also Swiss as We Know Recommends that Hassler from His Experience during the Trigonometric Survey in Switzerland Might Be the Person

To Direct the Effort the Difference between the Two of Them That's Quite Interesting Is that Hassler Doesn't Think It'll Be Possible To Survey the Very Small Inlets of the Atlantic Seaboard He Doesn't Have a Methodology

So What I Would Like To Do with My Time Today Is Two Things the First Is To Explore the World in Which Jedidiah Morse Lived before He Wrote some of His Textbooks this Is Not Covered in the Paper and the Second Is To Look at those Textbooks those Geographic Textbooks That He Did Write and How They Reflected that World that He Lived in and Morse Is Considered the Father of American Geography and His Textbooks Are Understood as Helping To Fashion a Sense of American Nationalism and American Identity and I Don't Disagree but I Want Us To Recognize that American Nationalism and American Identity at the Time Required

I'm How He's Cautious about Talking about Benjamin Franklin in a Room Full of People Who Spend More Time with Him than I Do but It May Be a Surprise for some of You To Know that Franklin Had a Not Terribly Mild Obsession with Canada When He Arrived and this Obsession with Canada Shaped His Idea of the Revolution and the Process of Creating the United States When He Arrived in Paris in 1776 Here I Want You To Imagine the Image of Franklin Wearing His Marten Fur Cap He Wore that Hat To Announce Himself as an American He Had Been to France Twice Before and When He Was There He Wore Powdered Wigs He Dressed like a European this Time Was Different He Was Representing the United Colonies and He Used this Wig To Demonstrate that He Was Now an American He Got that Where He Was Use the Hat Sorry the Martinsburg Hat To Announce that He Was in America He Got that Hat in Canada

And Then He Loses Everything It's a Very Sad Story and So He Moves To but To Sum It Up Very Quickly He Moves Two Opelousas in Louisiana or What Is Now Today Louisiana and He Becomes a Surveyor for the General Land or for the Land Office There so It Begins To Chart the Atchafalaya Basin and the Opelousas Paris and He Comes Up with this Idea that Hey I Can Make a Lot of Money if I Create this Map of the Orleans Territory and Then Sell It Right so He's Trying To Latch On to this Map Craze that It's Just Beginning To Emerge in the United States as You Can See with the Image Here this Is a the Map That He Ends Up Creating

And So It Changes this Cartographic Image and It's a Way of Attaching Louisiana to or this Western Border to American Control or Asserting the Scientific Authority over It and So Here's another Zoomed in Region and I Just Want To Point Out that John Mallesh as Everyone Knows the Famous Compiler Right so He Takes Darby's Map in 1816 and Well He Takes His Survey Notes and He's GonNa Be the Guy Who Publishes It and Louisiana Has a Very Different Appearance Right so Mallesh Takes Darby's Map and Throws It in There and Darby Is So Upset because He Felt that Molest Short He Didn't Include a Footnote to Him You Know He Plagiarized His Work but It Changes this Image of Louisiana and We Don't See this Neutral Ground Region
