Family Bible Records in the Washington County Free Library, Hagerstown, Maryland

These Bible records have been taken from copies, notes, and in some cases, the Bibles themselves, on file at the Washington County Historical Society. Washington County was often a stopping point for families heading west to Ohio, Illinois and beyond. Bible records are invaluable for research in the times prior to civil registration, offering a rich source of birth, marriage, and death information. The Searcher

Johannes Conrad Kriegbaum was born in Germany. He married Anna Maria (unknown) ca. 1764. They had nine children. Conrad died ca. 1821 in Allegany County, Maryland.

Maryland Genealogical Society Bulletin

Solomon Brandenburg was born in Germany about 1712 and his three oldest sons eventually immigrated to the United States. Many of his descendants lived in Maryland but others lived in Kentucky and other parts of the United States. Also includes Maryland Brandenburgs not linked to any particular family.

Boward Family in America

Philip Derr (1750-1821), of German ancestry, was probably born in Pennsylvania, moved to Middletown, Maryland, and in 1777 married Barbara Koogle. Descendants and relatives lived in Maryland, Ohio, Indiana, Wisconsin, Washington, Oregon and elsewhere.

American Book Publishing Record

John Nicholas Long (1702-1776) married Anna Maria Studebaker, and in 1736 they immigrated from Germany to Philadelphia, settling in Germantown and later moving to Washington County, Maryland. Descendants lived in Maryland, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois, Iowa and elsewhere.

John Russell Hamilton was born 28 January 1891 in Ridgedale, West Virginia. His parents were Isaac Hamilton (1859-1944) and Annie Elizabeth Zinn (1862-1948). His grandparents were James Hamilton, Nancy Bixler, Saylor M. Zinn and Mahala Brown. He married Sara Royer in 1912 and they had two children. He married Bonnie Aline Smith in 1923. They had two children. Ancestors, descendants and relatives lived mainly in West Virginia. Maryland, Pennsylvania and Switzerland.
