This is less obtrusive than children's full-sized coloring books. It is printed on one side only, so that if you use magic markers, you are far less likely to have the colors deface your other pages. I've omitted page numbers so that your finished art is suitable for framing or use in your crafts. I still recommend that you place a piece of paper underneath your drawing so that it can absorb any excess ink. You are free to copy the pages for personal use, but if you are interested in using these images for teaching a class, please contact me for additional licensing.
